### BROKENS

There is no doubt that if you have driven on Billericay's roads or walked its pavements that you will have noted how poor a condition they are in.

The BDRA has on behalf of the residents of Billericay and with the assistance of our members been raising for some months specific cases where urgent repairs are required. These have all been reported to Essex County Council via our local Councillors. In addition, we have been making freedom of information requests to Essex County Council to get to the truth behind the state of our roads and payements.

Our Councillors have reported back that all issues have been raised with the relevant parties and they also announced that in November last year some 700 road defects were repaired, however, our freedom of information requests showed that at the end of December 2023 there were 21,559 road defects still to be

repaired and 90,701 pavement defects to be repaired. So at that rate of progress, it would take ECC a further 31 months just to repair all the current defects.

ECC did agree some extra funding when they set their most recent budget in February 2024, however, they also know that the amount they set aside was many millions below the cost that their own officers had said was needed to repair all defects.

So please join our campaign to get ECC to change its policies and to get our roads and pavements into a safe condition. Billericay, we need your help, firstly please report any defects that you come across to us at resident@bdra.org so that we can report them to ECC.

While we will continue to campaign throughout 2024 to try and persuade ECC to repair our roads and pavements, we will be asking you all to support that campaign.

Our Chair Keith Bailey resigned recently due to personal reasons. We would like to thank Keith for his hard work and contribution during the last two years and wish him well for the future.

### Dear Editor.

In reply to Neil Stanley's letter in the March 2024 edition of the resident.

We have had Digital Telephones now for over two years.

Some key points about the new digital system:

- \* You are best to attach digital handsets to the system, not all existing older handsets work.
- \* You will need electrical points for all your phones, either digital or through the supplied adaptors.
- \* It all works through WIFI, so if the electricity goes out then everything stops working.
- \* Its therefore important to have a charged mobile if possible.

As for personal alarms through digital:

- \* There are issues relating to connectivity and loss of electricity for older personal alarms.
- \* There are though GPS personal alarms available through some providers.
- \* A GPS alarm works literately anywhere, as it does not connect through your house phone line.
- \* My wife uses AXA Health Taking Care, although there are other providers.
- \* Our yearly price for a one person system is £295.

I have just finished reading February's magazine and would ask the following:

Regarding the Post Office closure article, Is BDRA aware that the One Stop shop currently provides a valuable Paypoint service which will also be lost when it closes?

Regarding the blue/white recycling bag rollout, I assume that now Councillor Moore has publicly acknowledged that the 'box kite' bags are not fit for purpose and will be the subject of a rethink, the Council will be looking for additional funding, either in the form of reducing services or increasing charges. Can I ask BDRA to use its influence to get the discriminatory green waste recycling payment policy changed. Although all rate paying households continue to fund the green waste collection service, the council will not collect green waste from households who wish to pay for this additional service by cash/cheque. Basildon Council currently accepts payment of Council Tax bills in cash via Paypoint, so why not green waste bills? After all, every £50 collected in cash is £50 less that has to be found from existing funds for new recycling bags! I suppose the old box kite bags could be sold as home compost kits!! On a serious note, as a society, we are not yet at the point when everyone is on-line and this policy is discriminatory. The council is, after all, funded by the residents for the residents - all of them!

### LOCAL PLAN UPDATE -

#### Don't look back in anger

March 3rd saw the second anniversary of the withdrawal of the ruinous old Local Plan which would have seen the borough give up 1000 acres of Green Belt and brought about a 25% increase in population by 2034.

Since then, four of the Billericay Local Plan sites have gone to appeal, with two lost and two saved. A fifth was, regrettably, approved by the planning committee.

We remain very grateful for the Plan's withdrawal – but to reap the benefit we need to be rejecting applications to build on the Green Belt, and the new Local Plan should protect Green Belt rather than surrendering it to developers.

#### **New Local Plan** brought forward

In response to Michael Gove's letter, the Council has brought forward its timetable for our new Local Plan. The first of two consultations will now be in the last quarter of this year, with submission to the government in the summer of 2025.

It's important that we get a new Local Plan, but not at any cost, and we are concerned that this ambitious timeline will make the Council hasty and disinclined to take on board comments made during the consultations. An environmentally focused Local Plan, that uses little or no Green Belt, will be the simplest and quickest to deliver.

Recent changes to planning regulations mean that our position at appeal improves as soon as a draft is published.

#### **Upcoming planning** applications

We anticipate there will soon be a planning application for 250 houses in the Laindon Road-Frithwood Lane "green wedge"; this is one of Billericay's most important areas of Green Belt, reaching up to the High Street conservation area. It's astonishing that this area was included in the

### The Reading Celebrating Rooms celebrates 160 years of serving the community



uilt by and for the residents of Billericay - "to educate the working classes and to aid the growth and improvement of the common man".



Tucked away between the Kodak shop and Shelley's clothes shop is The Reading High Street, Rooms, 73 Billericay. A compact but welcoming community space.

In 1864 group of local people founded the Billericay Reading Rooms. They agreed that periodicals, newspapers and books be purchased

placed in the rooms for perusal by all. With literacy so limited and no public libraries this was one of the few options for people to practise their reading. In the 1860's newspapers ranged from 1 old penny upwards per issue, however with a Labourer earning £36.04d, Policeman £53.94d, and a Teacher £93.76d per annum an old penny was a huge amount of money. To buy

or even to see a newspaper you had to be seriously rich or have rich friends who might let you look at their copy.

Initially the Reading Rooms were a gentleman only venue. In the early 1900's it allowed the entry ladies but only on Wednesdays from 7.30am to 4.30pm, but this was stopped in 1906 - the reason was not given in the minutes. However, in the minutes there are recorded complaints about rowdyism but whether these two things were connected we will never know.

In the 1930s, after the public library came to Billericay, the use of the rooms switched to recreation, with a billiard table, darts and similar pastimes being available.

Vice-chair of The Reading Rooms, Heather Stuart recalls, 'My family would have been the type of family The Reading Rooms sort to help. My mother was one of ten children, with her father a thatcher by trade. They lived in a two up, two down on the high street. I remember visiting The Reading Rooms as a child, but my mother always called it The Recreation Rooms.'

The people who hire Reading Rooms today are diverse: history groups, many and varied charities, parties and private events and local societies.



The more unusual are the art groups with live models, the music groups practising for their exam on brass instruments.

The Reading Rooms is today a vibrant and well used space with regular events during the week, along with many ad hoc events. As the Reading Rooms were built by the people of Billericay, for the people of Billericay very competitive rates are available for residents of the town. ### Billericay Tree Wardens (BTW) Development must know its limits and keep within them and respect the environment

e have just been informed that the BBC has applied a series of Woodland TPOs on the ancient woodland that are in the gardens of 108 / 118 / 120 / 122 / 126 / 128 & 130 Norsey Road that run down to NW's Main Ride. It represents a considerable area of Ancient Woodland. The BTW requested such protection post the shocking felling of ancient woodland back in early 2023. We wanted to safeguard similar wanton and reckless damage to our town's tree stock, and to Norsey Wood itself, as had occurred in the garden of a neighboring property back in early 2023. Also, it was a damaging incident to the Norsey Wood Society who have been the guardians of the wood since the early 1970's and still nurture and defend it today as

Trees and wildlife don't recognize boundaries so leave our ancient woodland alone is the message. It transpired that the felling at a nearby property was not an illegal act but there had been no consultation or discussion at the ethical / wildlife / environment level.

We have thanked the several who have made representations to achieve this protection on our behalf and not least BBC Enforcement whose hands were legally tied at the very beginning but have pressed ahead with ensuring that future threats to existing ancient NW woodland have been averted. To apply so many Woodland TPOs on seven properties is no mean feat and would have involved much Tree Officers time, expense and legal work behind the scenes -But it has been successfully achieved.

However, we failed to convince the Forestry Commission that there had been a breach of their rules but one of our "Friends of the BTW" pursued the idea relentlessly right to the very end

which we are very grateful for. Like all journeys, they can be valuable learning curves.

We intend to get an article in the BDRA Newsletter about this sorry saga and will express in no uncertain terms how this type of thoughtless and reckless behaviour is not to be tolerated in our town. Development must know its limits and keep within them and respect the environment.

## The legal implications of a Grandparent's

£50 legacy

judge has ruled that a grandad was entitled to give his grandchildren just £50 each out of his £500k estate.

Frederick Ward died aged 91, splitting his estate equally between his two surviving children, Terry and Susan. Frederick had another son, Fred, who sadly predeceased him, leaving five children of his own.

Frederick left £50 legacies to each of Fred's children. They thought they should have been entitled to a 1/3rd split of Frederick's estate between them, so they took the family to court over their missed inheritance.

However, the judge did not find in their favour and deemed that it was entirely rational for the disappointed grandchildren to receive such a small sum because of their limited involvement with their grandfather over the years.


Maybe if they had visited their grandad and had a better relationship with him, he would have wanted to leave them a greater share of his estate. They could have received the circa £33k that they thought they each were entitled to instead of the gesture of £50.

In this case and many others like it, a lot of money is spent on bringing and defending the claim, and many family dynamics are not recoverable, as there is a lot of anguish and turmoil when dealing with claims.







#### Seats Still Available, Please Pay Now

You'll never forget your first sight of Blickling, when the breath-taking Jacobean mansion comes into view, flanked by ancient yew hedging and encircled by its historic park. Blickling's owners have used the estate as a quiet refuge for centuries, while playing their part on the political stage.

Philip Kerr, 11th Marquis of Lothian, left the estate to the National Trust in 1940, and he is vital to its story. He was instrumental in drafting the National Trust Act in Parliament in 1937, which enabled the first large-scale transfer of country houses to the National Trust in lieu of death duties. The present house was built from 1616-25 by Robert Lyminge {the architect of Hatfield} for Sir Henry Hobart, 1st Baronet, Lord Chief Justice to James 1. Four centuries of good husbandry have made Blickling's gardens one of the greatest in England. Take a stroll through the newly restored walled garden and there are also 950 acres of woodland and parkland. Subject to volunteer availability there is The RAF Oulton Museum to visit.
