

#### **Local Elections**

ay's local election was the most significant in years, with all 42 seats, rather than the usual 14, being contested. The Conservatives lost their majority and Labour are now the largest party with 18 seats against the Conservative 13. Independents make up the rest

It is very likely Labour will lead a coalition or minority administration. There will be no more elections for two years, so we now have greater clarity on who will lead the Council as the new Local Plan is shaped.



#### **Kennel Lane**

The Hill Group have put in a detailed planning application for 179 houses on their Kennel Lane site. Approval is a near formality as the Appeal Inspector granted them Outline Planning Permission.

Their initial ideas, shared with the public in December — would have seen housing narrow the linkage between their site and the little linear park behind Bell Hill Close, which provides a vital wildlife corridor between Mill Meadows to the north, the Hill site and wider countryside around it.

Hill agreed to our suggestion that the plot in the northwestern corner of the site be shifted, leaving a more open area (marked X in the revised proposal) which allowed the corridor to remain open.



As Hill already had Outline Planning Permission, they were under no obligation to make this change. We're very grateful to them for having agreed to make this small but disproportionately worthwhile change.

#### **Ancient Woodland**

ur invaluable Ancient Woodlands are badly affected by development in their vicinity, so it's vital that planning applications and our new Local Plan recognises their importance by leaving sizeable buffers around them, and recognising their vital role as reservoirs of biodiversity in the wildlife corridors across the wider landscape.

But not all of the smaller woods are on Natural England's "Ancient Woodland Inventory" so we've collected evidence and made applications to them for 5 small west Billericay woods to be added.

### Hello Chairperson and Committee Members,

I would like to give some feedback on my recent visit to your fair town of Billericay. Today the weather was good for walking from my friend's house up to Billericay. Exercise after all is good for us mentally and physically. Also, as a non-car person it is feet or public transport. As the second of these are to say the least sparse to non-existent along Tye Common Road to Billericay it was always going to be Shank's Pony. So off I set in sensible boots along to Billericay.

Oh my what a trial it is! The pavements are so uneven with potholes and missing tarmac cracks and undulating that it makes walking very difficult. As someone who has balance issues it was unnerving in case I stumbled and fell. There are also no safe crossing spots on Tye Common Road, by which I mean no dropped curbs with the special slabs that indicate to partially sighted pedestrians that they can safely step down to the road to cross and be assured that a matching dropped and identifiable curb is available on the opposite side. This continues on every street in Billericay I have walked upon today. They are inaccessible for anyone with mobility needs wheelchair uses and partially sighted/ blind. I think as concerned persons about Billericay these are issues that need to be considered and actions to improve would be good.

I am aware you are currently involved in the proposed plans for new development. These issues apply to new estates too and I encourage you to include accessibility including safe crossings for all pedestrians in your lobbying. From experience they are not always provided at the time of construction. It would be wonderful if some improvements to pedestrians safe walking routes where given priority by yourselves and Basildon Council.

You may be lucky to see them diving for fish, or to see our visiting kingfisher flash by! The Canada Geese strut around, each pair followed by a number of fluffy yellow goslings, which look so appealing despite the noise and mess that they make. Hidden in the water's edge, families of moorhen & coot chicks dart about in search of tasty flies and grubs, whilst overhead the swifts and terns swoop and glide, performing their acrobatics. Recently, 35 different types of birds were seen or heard during our Early Morning Bird walk!

### The Land Registry and the Property Alert service

ost people have heard of the Land Registry, but what is it, and what does it do?

The Land Registry is a non-ministerial government department created in 1862. They advise that their vision is "A world-leading property market as part of a thriving economy and a sustainable future" and that their purpose is "We protect your land ownership and provide services and data that underpin an efficient and informed property market."

Their responsibilities are to provide:

- a reliable record of information about ownership of and interests affecting land and property
- owners with a land title, guaranteed by the government
- a title plan that indicates general boundaries

How does the Land Registry help me protect my property?

Properties can be at risk for a number of reasons, including if —

- your identity's been stolen
- you rent out your property
- you live overseas
- the property's empty
- the property is not mortgaged
- the property is not registered with the Land Registry

If any of the above apply to you, you may consider signing up to the Land Registry's digital Property Alert Scheme. It is a free scheme run by the Land Registry and allows you to monitor if there has been any significant activity on a property that you have recorded an alert against. This could be a registration of a mortgage, another application or significant. The service will not prevent fraud but will alert you to potentially fraudulent activity should someone make an application and provide you with the contact details of the party making the application.




