Local Plan Update

Further to our article last month, the Leader of Basildon Council, and Burstead Ward councillor, Andrew Baggott, has written to the Government reiterating that the council plans to stick with original timescales and submit a new Local Plan for examination in mid-2026, and not a year earlier as the Government was suggesting in a letter to the council last December.

Somewhat ironically, in last year's public consultation on the new Local Plan, a large number of people said that they would like to see an earlier start date for the plan, rather than 2027 which is when the council aim to have it finally adopted. A large proportion of people responding to the consultation said that the Green Belt should be protected, and Brownfield land should be prioritised for new development. The full report on the Issues & Option consultation should be published on the council's website by the time you read this.

The next major event should be the publication of a draft Local Plan later this year, showing for the first time the sites that are being allocated for development. There will be another public consultation at that point.

Some good news - but we need your help!


In January we were delighted to learn that Basildon had won the Potash Road appeal – the Planning Inspector agreed with Basildon that the 150 houses and care home proposed there shouldn't go ahead. This site would have been destroyed, and the area blighted, under the withdrawn Plan.

Councillors had recently started approving Green Belt applications that were in the old Plan – such as at Southend Road in Billericay, with some despairing of the possibility of winning appeals.

Were they throwing in the towel, or picking their battles?

We need the Potash Road victory to encourage them, as they will soon have two or more major planning applications to decide — on either side of London Road in SW Billericay. And for this we need your help too!

- Scott Housing have submitted an application for an out-of-town Lidl supermarket and 130 houses south of London Road.
- While Redrow plan 480 houses north of London Road\west of Mountnessing Road.

2023 Billericay High Street report

omparing the '2023 High St Logging' to the pre-Covid (2019) version, the most noticeable change is the Food Hospitality section which has grown from 45 to 55. It looks like the eateries are doing well and are here to stay.

Independent Retail has decreased from 42 to 37 while Chain Retail has decreased from 22 to 20. The Bank section however has gone from 6 to 1.

Maybe the most surprising result is that the Empty category has only gone from 11 to 13 over 4 years. Once the Community Café has opened that will make it 12. Maybe things are not as bad as they look and holding out for more shops rather than turning the empty buildings into residential on ground level is worth fighting for.

BT's tE thing trouble!

ike Andrews's article on the switch from BT to EE in the last issue wastimely. On 17th January I noticed an error in my BT bill (for 5 months Iwas charged for an X-Box I didn't have) and phoned Customer Services for arefund. The BT 'guide' (as operatives are now called) said "A technicalfault has caused this to happen a lot lately." A £50 credit would be on mynext bill. While she dealt with this, she told me that within 18 months alldomestic subscribers would be switched to EE...BUT if I did so NOW, there wereoffers and reductions to be had. She came up with an offer I couldn'trefuse and I agreed to switch, like for like.

The new hub and adapter came by post and an EE technician installed it free of charge on the 26th. The broadband worked fine but our landline and new adapter had to be near a plug point. Mine wasn't so I had to move our wall-mounted phone to another room not where we Nothing had been wanted it. mentioned about this in the original sales pitch and I asked the technician whether this was a common problem for him. His less than helpful response to both questions was "Tell me about it!" We then found that EE had not sent a adapter answerphone extension upstairs; he told me to phone EE to order one. The technician was helpful and talked me through what to do when it arrived. Ten minutes after he left, I found that our landline would no longer accept calls from O2 (and other) mobile networks.

I immediately phoned EE to order a second adapter and to report the O2 fault with the phone. The 'guide' was friendly, helpful, but surprised EE hadn't changed my telephone number(!) He also said that the technician should have told me that

EE charged for a second adapter but because of the O2 problem (which he would get fixed remotely) he would send me a free one. On my next bill I would receive a charge for it and a credit at the same time.

Unbelievably my first EE bill arrived by e-mail late on the 27th. It included the cost of and credit for the second adapter but omitted the £50 X-Box refund. I had also originally asked to be billed quarterly (as with BT) but this was a monthly bill. Before I could phone to get this corrected, EE texted me that the O2 problem was fixed! We tested the landline but found that my it was dead: we could neither make nor receive calls.

On the 28th I phoned EE on my mobile to report the fault, get quarterly bills, and get my X-Box refund. We needed a second mobile to receive the OTP code with which to identify ourselves. A technician was able to fix the O2 and landline problems remotely while on the line; we arranged for my refund to be paid directly into my bank account; but EE was only able to issue monthly bills.

On the 30th my final BT was e-mailed to me. I could view it via a link. Or rather I couldn't. I was no longer a BT subscriber therefore I had no account and no link. I phoned BT to ask for a paper final bill to be sent. The 'guide' arranged this but noticed that it contained a £43 refund (because payment is made in advance). He told me I wouldn't get this unless I claimed it, which I then did. It should be paid into my bank account directly in late February(!) Fingers crossed!

By the 31st I still hadn't been notified of the dispatch of my second adapter for the answerphone extension so I phoned EE and was told that the 'guide' of the 26th had forgotten to order it. I was promised that one would be sent first thing. It arrived on 3rd February. I set it up but although the extension worked, the answerphone was not recording any messages. In addition on the 4th we found that when we had an incoming call and my wife and I both wanted take part in the chat using both phones as in the past (a 3-way call), we found we couldn't. Either the landline would cut out the extension or vice versa.

On the 4th I phoned EE and was told that 3-way calls were not a feature of EE's service and my answerphone might not be compatible. Dissatisfied, I phoned BT to explain the problem and to say that this was not the 'like for like' I had been promised. I spoke to 'guide' Jacqui from Lincoln (who MUST be the star employee of the year). She told me that my two phones were not 'talking' to one another. She checked my contract and said that 3-way calls WERE definitely part of the agreement and BT had failed to honour it. As a solution she said she would send me two new SMART Digital Wi-fi phones free of charge. Three-way calls would then be possible. In addition my answerphone should then work.

All the kit arrived on the 7th. I set it up and it works (so far). Except for my answerphone. However that is no longer a problem because the shiny new black phones have voicemail which means callers' messages can be retrieved.

A word to the wise. EE staff have been well-trained in terms of affability not always so much in professionalism. Calls to customer services can take anything from 1 to 45 minutes to get through. Be patient, polite and persistent. No doubt, when it comes to YOUR turn, most of you will have a trouble-free conversion. If not, at least you now know what expect: a Shakespearean tale of confusion, mixed messages, and mistakes. But fear not, for All's Well That Ends Well in BT's Comedy of EErors.

At the Billericay library you can check out the usual fiction, non fiction, large print, young adult, reference books and DVDs, they also have quite a large number of computers people can book up and use to access the internet.

In the library the children's corner is particularly delightful with bright comfy seating and colourful wall displays by local primary schools. They run a rhyme time singalong every Friday between 11-11.30am aimed a pre-school children. They also run a summer and winter reading challenge for kids, they can obtain a medal for simply reading in the holidays!

The library also hosts a 'warm welcome' for all residents on Tuesday afternoons between 10am-1pm with free tea or coffee and different activities available.

If knitting is your thing, then they host a 'knit and Banter' afternoon on Tuesdays between 2-4pm. They have IT support on Wednesday afternoons between 1.30-4.30pm

Whilst all over the UK, other councils are cutting their budgets for parks by £20 per person, here in Billericay we have had a huge investment for the future.

The new skatepark is well underway, although the recent wet weather may have delayed the finish date a little! Hopefully, it will be opened by the late Spring, in time for all our youngsters to enjoy using it over the summer. Hopefully too, it should be vandal proof! Nearby, the outdoor gym has been reinstalled with a new soft surface beneath it. So plenty of opportunities there to follow up on your New Year's resolution.

The new modern design noticeboards, complete with 'green' roofs are due to be installed soon at the park. Basildon Council is renewing all their park boards, so that they have a unique corporate image.

Many of you will have seen the new Changing Places unit between the café and our Information hut. It does not look very exciting but inside are modern changing facilities, including a shower and toilet, which is available for disabled users should they need it.

Situated outside this unit, next to a slim grey

metal box, is an unusual looking royal blue object. It's about a metre and a half tall and has various buttons and appendages to it. Whatever can it be? It looks rather like an old fire hydrant. In

fact, you'd be fairly close with that description!
For those of you who have investigated, you may have discovered our new



state-of-the-art drinking water fountain. Bought by the Friends of Lake Meadows two or three years ago, and delayed by the Covid pandemic, the unit has been waiting for a suitable moment to be installed by Basildon BC. There are three parts to it — a bottle filling spout at the top, then a drinking fountain and finally a dog bowl at ground level — the latter has to be filled from a water bottle! So even if it is another hot summer, we should all be able to get free water to drink, dogs included!

Next door, we are planning to give the Friend's Information Hut a much-needed facelift, with new panels and a few new coats of paint on the outside. Not many people realise what a gem lies inside this little hut. The walls are covered with information about the history of the park; there are

old photos from the past showing the boats, the Fort and old play equipment. Information is available about the trees in the park, including a new map showing over 50 named trees. If anyone is interested do call in when the hut is open. We do very much need some volunteers to help man the hut. It only involves sitting outside, talking to people for a couple of hours a week or fortnight - do contact us if you could help! And of course, now gardening has started up again on Tuesday mornings, we always can do with extra help there to look after all the flower beds.







You'll never forget your first sight of Blickling, when the breathtaking Jacobean mansion comes into view, flanked by ancient yew hedging and encircled by its historic park. Blickling's owners have used the estate as a quiet refuge for centuries, while playing their part on the political stage.

Philip Kerr, 11th Marquis of Lothian, left the estate to the National Trust in 1940, and he is vital to its story. He was instrumental in drafting the National Trust Act in Parliament in 1937, which enabled the first large-scale transfer of country houses to the National Trust in lieu of death duties. The present house was built from 1616-25 by Robert Lyminge (the architect

of Hatfield} for Sir Henry Hobart, 1st Baronet, Lord Chief Justice to James 1. Four centuries of good husbandry have made Blickling's gardens one of the greatest in England. Take a stroll through the newly restored walled garden and there are also 950 acres of woodland and parkland. Subject to volunteer availability there is The RAF Oulton Museum to visit.
