

Planning Matters

he latest public consultation on the emerging Basildon Local Plan closed in April. We are not expecting any further public activity on the plan until the council publishes a final version towards the end of this year. There will be another consultation at that point. Basildon council is working towards submitting the final Local Plan to the Government for examination early next year.

Bln parallel to the Local Plan, we are continuing to see planning applications being submitted for large scale housing estates on our Green Belt land, the latest being for 310 houses off of Greens Farm Lane.

This location was muted for development as long ago as 2013, and as recently as last year the land agent held a consultation on their plans. No doubt emboldened by the Government's relentless focus on house building, changes to national planning policies making it easier to get planing permission, and the recent approvals of other Green Belt developments around Billericay, it is not surprising that this new application has come to light. Sadly, we don't think it will be the last with developments on Outwood Common Road and Southend Road being considered. Our Green Belt is in danger of becoming grey! To keep up to date with planning matters please follow the Billericay Action Group on their Facebook group 'Save Billericay From Housing Developments'.

ave you heard of the Men's Shed? It's an initiative that was developed to offer a safe and supportive space for men to socialise with like minded individuals and have fun through activities such as woodworking, quizzes and games. It's particularly aimed at men who are dealing with changes in life bought about by retirement, dealing with mental health issues, or just looking for a bit of male company.

The Men's Shed started in 2019 at Little Burstead Hall and was set up by friends, one of whom had a father living with dementia (seeking practical activity), and got underway locally with the help of the Essex Shed Network.

Little Burstead Village Hall Committee, kindly provided the accommodation, and there were many generous donations received from local community groups, individuals and national charities.

Sessions are now held at Lake Meadows, on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, and for each session there is a charge of one pound. Every session has a different focus. Mondays are for a cuppa and a chat, Tuesday is woodwork, after all that the main purpose of a man's shed, and Wednesday is for those dealing with dementia and their partners. This is the only day at present, that is for men and women.

Their woodwork is supported by Friends of Lake Meadows, whom the group help with the renovation of benches and the construction of small items required in the park. Groups of children from Quilters School attend regularly and help finish these and other products, by sanding and painting. The results of their work are available for a donation at one of the events they hold or attend and are very much appreciated by all at the shed.

They are particularly proud of the dementia group; as well as offering

activities for those living with dementia and their partners, family or carer, it is a time when carers can get support. There is always help or advice or just a kind word from someone who is in the same situation, or maybe just a 10-minute break to go and make a cuppa and have a chat while someone takes over the caring role. Singing and dancing supported by a local musician, is particularly popular and the group performed at the Volunteer Awards Ceremony at the Towngate Theatre on the 4th March. The Happy Wednesday Dementia Group also hold a pop-up session at the Human Kind Café on the last Wednesday of every month with music, art, crafting and games.

Is this for you, are you missing male comradery, looking for a different focus in life, or just a friendly face and a chat? Then you should head for Men's Shed next to the Bowling Club, in Lake

Meadows, where there will always be a warm welcome.

- Jan who is a trustee and has been volunteering for 2 years, said 'she retired early and this voluntary role has given her a new purpose in life'
- Wayne, said 'he had worked with men all his life and missed the chat and banter, and it gave him a break from the wife!'
- Bob said that 'visitors to the Men's Shed all come as different people, but when you get here you are all the same and it has certainly helped with my mental wellbeing'.

The Committee thought this was a great community initiative, helping men struggling with change in their lives and supporting those living with dementia and their partners. In recognition of Dementia Action week, the BDRA has donated £100 to this initiative.

Residents Rise Ap Against Local Plan!

Basildon Council's Local Plan will create seismic change to Billericay and to the lives of its people. Carried out by local government based on a diktat from central government, it is astonishingly similar in format to a previous attempt to impose overwhelming change on Billericay's inhabitants. Then, in 1381, people rose up in the so-called Peasants' Revolt to try to prevent it. So far I have found 64 local men and women who took part. Will their 2025 descendants be equally determined to face the challenge to their way of life?

To raise money for a war against France, a poll tax of 12d per adult was imposed, the third one in four years, to be paid by rich and poor alike. It occurred against the background of a raft of earlier grievances during the reign of 13 yearold boy King Richard II. Control of central government was in the hands of his uncle John of Gaunt, but the poll tax was collected by local Commissioners. On 30th May 1381 Commissioner Bampton arrived at Brentwood to collect the tax owed by villagers from Barstable Hundred (each shire was divided into Hundreds) but was chased away by a large crowd among whom were "a certain weaver", wisely anonymous, from Billericay, John Stubber of Ramsden Bellhouse, and Richard atte Ree of Buttsbury. A second attempt to collect the tax was made on 2nd June and met armed resistance.

Over the next ten days the peasants organized themselves. Messages were sent from village to village across Essex; letters went to neighbouring counties asking peasants to rise; and a general outbreak of riot and plunder broke out. This presupposes the rebels' prior local and national preparedness and organization. Locally, William Cole and William Rydelere of Ramsden Bellhouse were part of a gang which attacked the King's mother's house at North Weald Bassett. The Sheriff's house at Coggeshall was attacked - William Saman of Great Burstead took part; and Childerditch manor was also attacked. John Geffrey, Bailiff of East Hanningfield,

led a band of rebels in an attack on Cressing Temple (its Prior was responsible for devising the poll tax) which included the "certain weaver" from Billericay, John Stubber, Richard atte Ree, and John Neuman of Rawreth.

There was clearly an organized, literate leadership at work, headed by three men: Wat Tyler, a tiler from Colchester and the rebels' commander-in-chief; Jack Straw, Captain of the Essex 'army', and Tyler's second-in-command; and John Ball, a Colchester priest born in Peldon and the 'brains' behind the Revolt.

Tyler and Straw crossed to Kent with 100 Essexmen to kick-start the revolt there. Acting in concert, the Essex and Kent contingents, intent on forcing the King to abolish the tax, set off for London on 11th June, gathering adherents en route. The Essex 'army' stopped at Chelmsford to attack the manors of the Bishop of London, and the Abbot of Westminster. By nightfall on the 12th the Essexmen were camped at Mile End and the Kentishmen at Blackheath outside the walls of London, each 'army' over 20,000 strong.

he rhododendrons are out now in the walk between the café and the gardens. Planted ten years ago by the Town Council, advised by RHS Hyde Hall, most have survived and create a beautiful scene, under planted with the pale-blue forget-me-nots.

Rhododendrons are a very large genus of over 1,000 species of woody plants in the Ericaceae or heather family and they can be either evergreen or deciduous. Species are generally native to eastern Asia and the Himalayan region but can be found anywhere in the world and are

widely distributed between latitudes 80°N and 20°S, being native to areas from North America to Europe, Russia, and Asia, and from Greenland to Queensland, Australia and the Solomon Islands. It is the national flower of Nepal and several other eastern countries.

Rhododendrons are not well-liked in the animal kingdom. Some moths and caterpillars will eat them, and weevils live amongst them, but they are known to be poisonous to cattle, and people have died eating 'mad honey' made by bees feeding on rhododendron and azalea flowers.

Contesting a will: Understanding undue influence

n the 2019 case of Rea v Rea, the Court of Appeal upheld a will despite claims of undue influence. The deceased had changed her will, leaving everything to one child instead of dividing it equally among four. The defendants argued undue influence, but the court found insufficient evidence, highlighting how challenging it can be to prove undue influence in will disputes.

Recognising undue influence

Undue influence often arises when a relative pressures a vulnerable person into making a will. Older individuals may be more susceptible to manipulation, especially by relatives they trust. Common signs include:

- Sudden changes to a will close to
- Unusual bank withdrawals
- Unexpected beneficiaries

- · A beneficiary's involvement in the will-making process
- Witnesses closely related to a beneficiary

Challenging a will on the basis of undue influence

A will can be set aside if undue influence is proven. The court defines undue influence as pressure that overpowers the testator's free will,



amounting to coercion or fraud. Factors the court considers include the testator's physical and mental condition, the duration of pressure, and whether professional legal advice was given.

What to do If you suspect undue influence

If you suspect undue influence while your loved one is alive, discuss your concerns with them. Encourage them to create a new will if necessary or consider a Lasting Power of Attorney to protect their finances. If the person has passed, you may need to pursue a Probate claim or contest lifetime gifts made to a potential perpetrator.

Seeking legal advice

Proving undue influence can be difficult, and without proper evidence, you could face significant costs. It is essential to seek expert legal advice to understand your options and pursue a claim effectively.
