THE LOCAL PLAN - WHERE ARE WE NOW?

he emerging Local Plan was withdrawn over a year ago now. Basildon Council has started afresh on a new version that they are planning to complete and adopt by the end of 2027. The new plan will be for the 15 years to 2042.

The process actually started late last year with a new call for sites i.e., asking land owners to put forward areas for possible future development in a new Local Plan.

The second phase will be an Issues & Options public consultation, being prepared for this June. This is a formal, but optional, consultation allowing residents and stakeholders to comment on high level themes that will inform the next Local Plan. There will be no site allocations at this stage.

The themes include the plan period of 2027 to 2042, housing need and type, affordability, spatial options (where to build), employment and environmental matters.

It is important that we have a big local response to the June consultation. As with previous consultations we will provide advice and guidance nearer the time.

We will not see any details on final housing numbers and proposed sites until the first draft Local Plan in 2024, and that too will be subject to public consultation as the plan making process dictates.

In parallel to the above, the Council has set up a Local Plan Residents Forum and the BDRA & BAG are involved.

Additionally, the Government is proposing key changes to national planning polices which could have a beneficial impact on the next Basildon Local Plan, most specifically allowing the limiting of housing numbers where the existing Green Belt is a constraint. Basildon Council has acknowledged that they will have to adapt the next Local Plan should the proposed Governmental changes become legislation, but we are pleased to see that they are already considering a more appropriate (hopefully lower than before) housing target based on the real local need.

Getting the housing target right is most critical as from that the scale of land required will be the obvious outcome. Protecting the existing Green Belt from development remains paramount.

But we also need to consider that that they are the right types of houses for local need, affordability is addressed, that the sites are in the right places to meet that localised need and are sustainable within our existing communities and environment. We also need to see adequate and early infrastructure provision.

We need a new Local Plan to stop speculative development and to deliver the houses we really need in a controlled way. As before we collectively need to support, inform and at times challenge the Council to ensure it's a good plan for the future of our town and the borough as a whole.



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Please note that if we refer to Councillors in our magazine or on our website we are referring to the elected ward Councillors on Basildon Borough Council. These are the Councillors that have ultimate say in planning applications via the planning committee and on Local Plan matters via the Cabinet or Full council. If, for any reason, we need to refer village, parish or town Councillors we will make

Dear Editor,

In response to Julian Whybra's letter last issue

The term affordable housing is a generic one and covers a large number of affordable tenures. Each one offers a different way to rent or part own a new home, depending on housing need and personal financial circumstance.

References to 80% of market rent relate to one affordable tenure only - Affordable Rent. Even then, 80% is a maximum and often the rent paid to the Housing Association is lower. Other affordable tenures, such as a Social Rent are heavily subsidised and the rent is significantly lower than that paid by affordable rent tenants. Shared Ownership and Shared Equity models offer flexible pathways to part ownership.

The real issue as to whether the homes are truly affordable and whether they benefit local people is that while the Local Planning Authority will start from a position of 35% affordable housing, with a 70:30 split between rented and shared ownership homes, Developers will argue minimal or zero affordable housing by reason of viability. This isn't unique to Basildon BC or Billericay; this is a tension that plays out daily on a national and local level. Hopefully Basildon BC will stay strong and hold Housebuilders and Developers to account and ensure that the interests of local residents are put before commercial gain.

Barrenleys Wood update

Readers will recall the tragedy of Barrenleys Wood, near Outwood Farm Road, where the landowner destroyed more than 6 acres of irreplaceable Ancient Woodland by dumping more than 50,000 tons of rubble on it.

BDRA worked with the Council to get an Enforcement Notice, requiring removal of the spoil, but the Planning Inspector said only part of the spoil must go - he couldn't require removal of the rest as it had been there more than four years.

Cllr Schrader has been in touch to say that the Council Enforcement team has been on site and confirmed that the required spoil has now been removed, and the residential caravans vacated as well.

We're very grateful for Andrew Schrader's persistent support with this, and we're also grateful to the Council Enforcement team for their efforts in what has been a challenging case.



The Norsey Road Monkey Puzzle Tree

orsey Road is known for its tree-line of mainly veteran oaks that add a Street Scene amenity quality; for the road is a prestigious address for house ownership. However, over the years when gap-site Developers acquire a property they invariably extend or replace the existing dwelling with something far larger that requires the removal of trees (veteran oaks in particular) from the front gardens. This usually refers to that side of the road whose properties back onto Norsey Wood but not exclusively.

In October of 2022 one our BTW members noticed that a For Sale sign had been put up outside a property on the opposite side of the road. In the front garden is a splendid mature and healthy Monkey Puzzle tree. Over the years we have realized that when a property changes hands, that is usually the time when trees come under a perceived threat; as the new owner may want a tree removed. In this case, the Monkey Puzzle represents not only a Street Scene amenity tree but also as a landmark as one drives or walks past it. We have reason to believe that the tree was planted in the early fifties.

On inspecting the Planning Application for the property, it became apparent that the Monkey Puzzle tree was to be felled So we checked with BBC Planning whether or not the tree had a TPO designation, but on being told not we then immediately applied for a TPO. A Basildon Council Tree Officer attended site and assessed that it met the necessary strict criteria for protection. As we understand it, the necessary legal paperwork for a TPO is being completed. It's not only our native tree species that can be TPO protected but fine specimens of ornamental trees also qualify.

There's an irony here, as the road's character and exclusiveness is jointly engendered by its proximity to a 175 acre Local Nature Reserve of Ancient Woodland and its SSSI designation coupled with its tree-lined front gardens. So removing any of the front garden trees has an overall harmful effect

on the Street Scene. Quite a few veteran and characterful trees have "disappeared" from Norsey Road in recent years due to "ambitious" development. Thankfully, a few of the veteran oaks in the front gardens are protected with a TPO but we remain vigilant of further threats to trees.

In March of last year, there was a third of an acre of Ancient

Woodland on Green Belt removed from one of the rear gardens along Norsey Road that extended down to Norsey Wood's Main Ride, the legality of which is still contested.

y the time you are reading this article, the new play area at Lake Meadows should be completed. And what an exciting and challenging play area it is! Based upon the Friends' story of the Wizard & Dragon and her lost eggs, the new area provides a range of equipment and activities that are accessible to young children of all abilities and which will encourage them to explore and investigate.

Lake Meadows is one of the first parks in the Borough to benefit from Basildon Borough Council's £9 million investment in their Play Review. Local families were consulted on the ideas for Lake Meadows last summer. A new skateboard park is also due to be installed soon at Lake Meadows and the outdoor gym equipment will be moved and new safer surfacing installed there.

Chairman of the Leisure and Environment Committee, Councillor Craig Rimmer said: "Play areas provide lots of fun and memories for children and their parents, and the best thing is they're totally free places to enjoy. We want to consult further on the play areas that were proposed for removal, to make sure that we are providing suitable opportunities for all young people in the borough".

Meanwhile, the Wizard and Dragon, which were commissioned by the Friends of

Lake Meadows in 2013, are showing signs of their age. As soon as the weather improves, they will be repainted again, so they should last this year. It would be lovely to replace them but at present this looks unlikely. The storybooks created at the time is now available free from our Information Hut or on-line at www.lakemeadows.org.uk

The old rocking horse in the play area, which was installed many years ago, has been rescued and is currently being 'stabled' before being fixed permanently somewhere nearby, as a static unit for children of the present and future generations to enjoy. We are trying to make contact with the descendants of Councillor John Barr, who was a Billericay Councillor during the 1970s and whom we believe was connected with the Rocking horse. If you know any of his family, please do contact.

Another addition to the park last



month, was the dedication of a tree in the garden area by the mayor of Basildon and two of the cast of Gavin & Stacey, the BBC's long-running, successful series. Neither Alison Steadman nor Larry Lamb, two of the actors, had ever visited Billericay before now. It is believed that their visit was filmed as part of a promotional video about a new TV series.

The Friends are currently looking




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PAYING YOUR SUBSCRIPTIONS
