The Joint Area Committee (JAC) are working hard

As a result of the recent boundary changes, Steeple View is now part of Billericay. Whilst Steeple View has its own Resident's Association, several members attended the recent JAC meeting. Their members were particularly looking for support concerning the potential new housing development in Dunton Road. It was hoped that all parties would be able to work together to support the future aims of Billericay.

New planning applications were reviewed and objections made to the Council where it was considered they would have a negative impact on the lives of those living in Billericay.

The composition of Billericay's High Street is currently being reviewed including the number of shops and businesses compared with other town centres in the area. It is planned to produce a survey to canvass the views of residents on how they use the High Street and what they would like to see in the High Street in the future. Although shopping habits are changing, the High Street is still the hub of the Community.

The eyesore at the corner of Radford Way is frequently discussed and we have featured articles in The Resident previously. There is now a hoarding around the site and although it does look tidier, we are continuing to lobby for a resolution and the long-term intentions for the site.

There is a considerable amount of funding available for Billericay youth art/musical projects from The Community Voices project run by Basildon Borough Council. Currently, there is no one driving or organising any events for the young people of Billericay and the BDRA will be looking to make further representations to Community Voices to ensure that the youth of the town do not miss out.

The JAC meet on the 2nd Thursday of the month at 7.30pm in the Reading Rooms. If you want to get involved or have concerns about something in the town, why don't you attend, everyone is welcome.

HELP THE BDRA CAMPAIGN TO IMPROVE BILLERICAY

State of Roads & Pavements

Like many of you we have been concerned with the deteriorating condition of Billericay's roads & pavements.

For example, we have seen how bad the condition of Hillside Road & Norsey Road is, and The BDRA wrote to our local District & Town Councillors to raise the issue and press for the repairs to be prioritised. However, this did not expedite the repairs.

So we approached the County Council with a freedom of information request to find out when these roads were due for repair, you may have noted that Hillside received patch repairs only on 27th October but as far as we are aware no date has yet been set by the Council for repairs to Norsey Road.

We also asked the County Council to show if they fairly distribute repair funds across Essex to identify if Billericay receiving its fair share. Unfortunately, this was just a computer says "NO" moment as they do not hold this data.

We will be continuing to contact our Councillors and the County Council to press for Billericay's roads and pavements to be brought up to an acceptable standard of repair. However, it would assist us if our members could bring all roads and pavements in need of repair to our attention.

Gone Mayflower High School and **Billericay pays tribute to Freddie**

he community stood together and helped raise over £32,000 for the family of 15 year old Freddie Coleman, a Mayflower High School student who tragically died in a road collision on Stock Road on 3 November. The Fundraiser, set up by close friends exceeded its target of £1,000 in just 24 hours with the help of anonymous donors and locals affected by this tragedy.

This devastating event has left the community of Stock and Billericay heartbroken. Dozens of flowers and letters were left outside Mayflower High School in tribute to 'Forever young' Freddie as well as hundreds of messages online. The family and parents of Freddie have paid tribute to their "beautiful boy", who was "loved by everybody who knew him, our kind, happy, funny boy", thanking everyone who has supported them.

Some of our roads are dangerous and have no safe






paving for pedestrians. At the time of writing, Essex Police are 'actively' investigating the incident, said to involve two vehicles and a suspected drink driving offence. They are asking for people with any information to come forward.





bout eighteen months ago, the Friends of Lake Meadows volunteers instigated the formation of Basildon Parks & Countryside Volunteers Network. So far there are 12 groups involved, who meet quarterly to share ideas and concerns, disasters and achievements, as well as receiving regular updates from the Parks Operations Manager.

Recently, representatives of all the volunteers in the Network were invited by Basildon Council to a special afternoon event at Wat Tyler Country Park to celebrate the work that we do. Forty volunteers including six of our gardeners and a member of our ecology team, joined councillors, members of the parks team and other staff members to celebrate the range of work that the groups undertake.

We heard details from the Parks Manager about the wide variety of green spaces in the Borough that includes five town parks, three country parks, sixteen open spaces and twenty recreation grounds, as well as several nature reserves. The huge variety of wildlife and the many different types of habitat is quite amazing, ranging from grassland and scrub, to ancient woodland, salt marsh, rivers and lakes. We, at Lake Meadows, are particularly privileged to have such a wide variety of birds and waterfowl visiting the park and the many species of trees and wildflowers that have been surveyed by the Friends is remarkable for a 40 acre town park.

Each group had put together a display of photographs of their team, digging, planting, weeding and doing 101 other jobs to support the Parks staff, whilst secretly rather enjoying themselves, making new friends and finding improvements in their own mental and physical wellbeing. The Council certainly appreciates all the work that all the volunteers undertake, which across the Borough, amounts to over 10 thousand hours per year. They admit that they really could not do without us! Our involvement is central to helping shape the future of our parks and open spaces. Hopefully we shall grow, ensuring that our parks and open spaces continue to flourish and that they will continue to be recognised as essential for our own health and for the

Billericay Tree Wardens (BTW)

Brightside Primary School – Planting Project

n the morning of Monday 6th November the Billericay Tree Wardens (BTW) enlisted the help of the pupils from the Eco-committee to plant a seven foot tall Silver Birch (pendula) and four butterfly attracting Buddleja bushes (davidii).

The planting complements a seated area bordered by timber planks previously installed by the school. The plant species were chosen for their relatively quick growing ability and attraction to insects. Tree Warden and Councillor Chris May joined us for the project (third in from the left), BTW's tree planter Nathan Hume is fifth in from the left followed by Fiona who has liaised with the school throughout. The young from the Eco-committee enthusiastically joined in the

planting process and were keen to apply the compost, tamping it down and finally applying the mulch! A word that became the 'word of the day' with much amusement! This is the second planting project that the BTW has undertaken at the school and we thank the teachers in charge for seamlessly organizing the event. The young already have the mindset as to the importance of nature and were ready for the challenge! The child protection policy restricts publishing




