In our March 2022 issue we reported the decision of Basildon Council to withdraw its draft Local Plan subject to some outstanding formalities. We are pleased to report that those formalities were completed at the Full Council Meeting on 3rd March. A new Local Plan will be prepared.

The decision of Basildon Council to take this action is a bold one, although they are not alone. Other councils have acted in the same way.

One of the key messages given by many of the speakers in the 3rd March meeting was the need to more closely involve residents in the production of the new Plan.

The BDRA/BAG has already written to the Leader of Basildon Council, Councillor Baggott, indicating our desire and willingness to help the Council to produce a new Plan which really does benefit residents. As we go to press we have not had any response to our offer.

# **Proposed Solar Farm Development**

Some residents may have seen the following headlines on the Essex Live website recently:-

Plans for a new solar farm the size of 38 football pitches in Essex have been launched. A planning application for a renewable power station which could power 11,000 homes in Crays Hall Farm, Billericay, was validated by Basildon Borough Council on March 1

n our December 2021 edition we reported on proposals for Solar Farms on land to the east of Billericay. The formal application has now been submitted to Basildon Council for one of these, in the vicinity of Crays Hall Farm.

The BDRA is of course supportive of the need for sustainable energy but is concerned that the drive for sustainability is sometimes clouding consideration of other factors, especially where Green Belt land is involved.

Our council is quite rightly proud of its Green Belt and as reported elsewhere has recently withdrawn its draft Local Plan, partly to ensure that it fully accords with the latest Government pronouncements

on the value of Green Belt. In addition to the Local Plan our Green Belt is also under threat of irreversible change from a number of other directions, and we already play host to one of the boroughs existing Solar Farms.

Basildon Borough Council already has policies for protecting Green Belt and has a good record of applying these diligently. We will be raising our concerns with the Council and encouraging them

to fully consider all the relevant issues, including any other recent decisions in respect of solar farm applications, which might be a guide.



# **No Fault Divorce**

he Divorce, Dissolution and Separation Act 2020 finally comes into force on 6 April 2022. This brings the biggest change to divorce law in 50 years.

Up until now, a couple who want to divorce either have to have lived apart for at least 2 years or, instead, rely on the other's adultery or unreasonable behaviour. The government has said that it hopes the changes to the law will reduce hostility in divorce and mean that divorcing couples are more likely to work together to resolve other issues.

The existing laws are still available but only until 31 March 2022 when there will be a week's break before the new law comes into force.

These are the main differences to the existing law and procedure for divorce:-

- It will no longer be possible to stop your spouse from divorcing you. Defended divorces become a thing of the past;
- It will now take at least 6 months to get a divorce from

when the application is first made to the court until the divorce is finalised. The idea is that after issuing the application there will be a 'period of reflection'. If during that period the divorce is still going to go ahead, the arrangements for any children and for the finances can be considered. They may of course not necessarily be concluded within this period;

- It won't be possible to ask that your spouse contribute towards the costs involved in the divorce proceedings or the court fee. It will still be possible to come to a private agreement but the court will no longer have the power to force a spouse to make a contribution;
- If both spouses agree, it will be possible for the first time to jointly apply for a divorce. This will require a high level of co-operation throughout the process. There are some provisions for what can happen if during it, co-operation is withdrawn by either spouse.

# Free defibrillator training sessions at the Reading Rooms

efibrillators are an essential part of trying to save the life of someone who's in cardiac arrest. They assess the heart rhythm and can deliver a high energy electric shock, called defibrillation, if it's needed.

We are very lucky to have a high number of defibrillators installed in cases in the High Street and surrounding areas see all the locations below.

It is not essential to be trained to use a defibrillator, anyone can use them, but in order to help people have the confidence to use the machines, should the need ever arise, the Trustees of the Reading Rooms propose to sponsor some free training sessions.

Each session will be held in the Reading Rooms, will last up to two and a half hours and will cover the use of the defibrillator and CPR, the chest compression technique. Up to 12 people can attend each class and it may be of particular interest to people working in or near the High Street. # Joint Area Committee Meeting Highlights

**St Agnes Road Parking:** Contact made with SEPP from which it was discovered that there is a backlog for the introduction of parking restrictions, the request for their introduction here having been partially successful.

**Development in Norsey Road** (between Headley Rd and Horace Rd): Concerns re the destruction of a considerable number of trees which once formed part of Norsey Wood but were in the garden of the property; however, as no tree preservation order was in place, the tree wardens could do little. Councillor Schrader is currently seeking further information.

#### Proposed demolition of garages in Salesbury Drive:

Concerns about the possible development of the site into residential properties by Waltham Forest Council. The site was used for the parking of cars which would be forced to park in the already crowded Salesbury Drive. Letter and comment forwarded to Councillor Schrader.

# New Care Home proposal for G J Staines site

The BDRA has become aware of a proposal to build a 70 bed care home on Green Belt land on Stock Road in the area currently occupied by G J Staines. The location is on the Billericay side of the boundary between Basildon and Chelmsford Borough Councils. A Public Consultation was held in Stock Village Hall on 19th February, however whilst many councillors were informed of the event, disappointingly there was no indication outside the hall to tell of the delights inside and only a limited number of residents of Billericay appear to have been informed. A Planning Application is expected soon.
