Local Plan - Time For Action!

By the time you read this, Basildon Council should have launched an Issues & Options public consultation on the new Local Plan.

At the time of going to press for this edition of The Resident no details of the consultation had been released by the Council but we are expecting it to start on the 27 June and run for 10 weeks until 5 September.

We therefore ask that you keep an eye out for communications from the Council. We understand that they will be using multiple channels to do so – print media, social media, email and web site.

We also ask that you check the Billericay Action Group (BAG) website (www.billericayactiongroup.org.uk) and their Facebook Group for more information. Search for 'Save Billericay From Housing Developments' on Facebook and ask to join the group if you are not already a member.

Information can also be found on the BDRA website **(www.bdra.org)** and we can also be found on Facebook by searching for 'Billericay District Residents Association'.

BAG will provide advice and guidance on how to respond to the consultation.

We would like to see a big response from the residents of Billericay right across the borough. We are being given the opportunity to air our views early in the process before any sites have been selected so we have a chance to influence the outcome. We urge you to take time to participate. Thank you in anticipation for your support. Please keep in mind that we need to see the right number of houses, of the right type and in the right places.

TAKING ACTION: Potholes driving you potty? Lisa Ronchetti

Driving down one the most scenic roads in Billericay I am met by a cluster of craters which resemble something of a Star Wars movie or the landing on the moon. Just the other day I counted the number of potholes on a ten-minute journey from Stock Rd to the High Street – 13, and that's one route amongst many.

I've even started to memorise some of the 'big ones' thanks to past trauma of near misses as I try to save my poor tyres (and my life) from oncoming traffic. To name a few, Heath Rd, Hatches Farm Road and the dreaded Hillside!

I know I am not alone in my pothole pity. Potholes are now one of the most talked about topics amongst residents online. So, what on earth, I hear you cry, is being done to save us from accidents, failed MOTs and turning into Mr Meldrew on the way to Iceland?

THE BILLERICAY SCHOOL

Well, our roads are 'looked after' (if that's what you can call it) by Essex Highways (part of Essex County Council), so I approached them for a statement, to which they replied;

"Due to the pressure on our limited resources, we prioritise our work and fix the higher-risk issues first. Unfortunately, we cannot undertake all works at once.

"This means we do the repairs that require immediate attention because of safety issues first,



and then move to more minor repairs. Residents can report a pothole on the Essex Highways website."

You will join me in stating that there are some horrific potholes

that haven't been given 'immediate attention' and are still where they were last month. The best we can do is continue to report any significantly large or dangerous potholes as well as other road surface issues, damaged street lights, overgrown trees or missing lit bollards online.

So let's take action! Here is what you can do...

Go online to this part of Essex Highways website. The site will take you to a map where you can insert the address and report the pothole or problem.

Urban Bridleways, Trees and Nature



There are several "ancient" bridleways that wend their way across the housing estates in Billericay. They are usually tree-lined, attract wildlife and evoke an "ambience" of wellbeing to the area. The metre wide bridleway itself is Basildon Council owned land and is maintained by them but the strip of land of varying width either side to the garden fences is usually still owned by the original Developer who does not maintain them and has no interest in them (and who may not now exist).

Some stretches of bridleway are maintained by the local residents who gather socially together in a community spirit and "garden" them with wildlife in mind. They carefully trim back the brambles and nettles so one can walk unimpeded along the bridleway. Whereas others complain that it is not their responsibility and leave them overgrown. One aggrieved gentleman, somewhat removed from environmental awareness, described the wild mix of flowering plants and young trees as "rubbish"! However, should there be a H&S risk of a mature tree shedding its deadwood or leaning precariously over, then the Basildon Council would intervene.

There has been an instance on the Queen's Park Estate where there is a sizeable piece of land between the bridleway and the adjacent garden fences that included a small woodland nearby and a line of standalone mature trees that have a TPO designation. A gap-site Developer had bought the plot of land via an auction house and had submitted a Planning Application for a single dwelling that was subsequently refused. A small band of residents had made it clear that they were strongly opposed to the idea. The BTW had initially been approached to advise. The bridleway, the standalone trees and the woodland make for an urban oasis for nature to thrive that would have taken away the wellbeing and countryside effect from the residents.

The Billericay Tree Wardens (BTW) view each bridleway and infill development on a caseby-case basis.

The importance of pre-nups for blended families

- cases where family members are making financial provision or where there are trusts in place

Should pre-nups be used in second marriages?

If one or both partners have been divorced before and are planning a second or subsequent marriage, this is another example of where pre-

nups should be considered. In such cases, it is not uncommon for one or both of the parties to have built up assets previously which they may wish to protect in the future.

Older couples are also more likely to have children from previous marriages or relationships and the needs of the blended family unit will need to be carefully considered. This is where a pre-nup can be extremely useful.
