

n April Janet Cosgrove, part of Billericay Town Twinning, welcomed a group of friends from Chauvigny, near Poitier in France.

The French group arrived at Stansted for their bi-annual visit and spent the weekend with their hosts exploring Essex.

Janet said: "We kicked off with a cultural trip to Windsor Castle on Thursday, which impressed the guests. On Friday, each host was free to entertain their guests in their own way. This included a visit to Hyde Hall, a bluebell walk or a good old fashioned pub lunch. That evening dinner was held at the De Beauvoir Arms where we were served a wonderful meal.

"On Saturday we took the train to Southend where we had a guided tour of the Prittlewell Hoard Anglo-Saxon burial at the Central Museum – excavated in 2003. The guide spoke in English and Jeannine, our Chairman, helped translate for our guests into French. After that we of course had to have the traditional meal of fish at chips at Thomassi's and then

we took them down the pier, by train - a novelty for our French guests as piers like Southend's don't exist in France.

That evening saw our farewell dinner at the Reading Rooms in Billericay where we all bought a plate of various foods. It was a most convivial evening before their return to Poitier airport on Sunday morning. Both our visitors and members of the association thought the visit was a resounding success."

Billericay Tree Wardens (BTW)

FIFTY SHADES OF GREEN A TREE WARDEN'S PERSPECTIVE!

he "danger" time for trees is when a property changes hands and the new owners are all for change. We were once asked by a property owner to check if the mature trees in their front garden were TPO designated and if the answer was in the negative then the trees would be felled! It's not the sort of research that Tree Wardens are keen to undertake!

One lady owner justified the removal of a c.200 year old healthy non-TPO oak in her front garden along the Norsey Road by an irrational list of reasons ranging from gutters becoming filled with leaves and her husband. "cannot comfortably read his newspaper in the front lounge anymore". In English law relating to trees, there is no such thing as a "A Right to Light" except for the fast growing leylandii. In our view, a professional Tree Surgeon could have recommended a trimming

regime and the "Street Scene" amenity value of the oak would have continued.

To counter this negativity, we have quite a few "Natural Guardians" in the town who take it upon themselves to either contact the BTC or the BTW when they suspect that a tree has come under a "perceived threat" unnecessarily. On various occasions trees have been saved from destruction or serious damage due to their intervention and we are thankful to them.

Most of the professional Tree Surgeons that we have met are passionate about trees as are our Basildon Council Tree Officers. There are those who claim to be Tree Surgeons but are not Accredited and are underinsured. so some research


may be required to check on their credibility. Of course, there are various legitimate reasons why some trees need to be removed and those reasons in our view should always be legitimate. The BTW are a subgroup of the BTC.

The Bluebells of Norsey Wood

One of the best things about Spring in Norsey Wood is, without doubt, the carpet of almost iridescent blue formed by the iconic native bluebells. They flower at a time when most trees are not yet in full leaf, and so this annual spectacle can be enjoyed laced with dappled sunshine, as the Spring warmth releases the heady aroma of the flowers and mixes it with the smell of the damp woodland floor.

Bluebells can spread fairly rapidly, but it takes 4 or 5 years for a new plant to grow from seed to a bulb large enough to flower. They are also weakened or can die if they are trampled, because the leaves can no longer feed the bulb. Something to consider the next

time you're tempted to tread on a few to get that perfect picture!

As Spring turns to Summer there will be plenty more wildflower gems to enjoy in the wood, perhaps not so spectacular. but equally precious.


