Cater Museum 74 High Street

For many years our High Street in Billericay was honoured to have a wonderful museum "The Cater Museum". Not only did hundreds of children enjoy a visit there, many being with school outings. Visitors to come to Billericay just to enjoy tours of the museum by the curator.

My own grandchildren visited with me, and when shown a gas mask by the Curator she finally had to agree with them that it was something Dr Who used. Not only was the museum a great asset of Billericay it was also the Head Office, for 86 years, of The Billericay Society. Which our committee visited often. It is a shame to be denied this wonderful asset of Billericay.

Since before the pandemic the museum has been closed for refurbishment and although inquiries have been made no proper answer has been received. We the former committee of The Billericay Society have been informed that they are awaiting planning permission to replace some of the windows.

The Cater Museum was established by Alice May Cater in honour of her late husband William Alexander Cater, a local antiquarian. It was opened to the public in 1960 and lies within a Grade II listed building.

In 2002 a Victorian kitchen garden was opened and in 2008 received £41,000 from the National Lottery for renovations to the rear of the building.

If anyone has any other information regarding the re-opening of the museum, please let me know. Enquiries have been made with the Billericay Town Council but they have no information either.



During that time more than 150 films have been screened, watched by over 7,200 people from Billericay and


surrounding areas.

BILLERICAY STRIDERS 10K ROAD RACE 2023

t's time to remind everyone about Billericay Striders' ever-popular 10K road race in 2023, which this year will be held on Sunday 5th November. This is the 27th annual running of the event and it is becoming increasing difficult to get a place, despite increasing runner numbers. This year entries sold out in 2 ½ days. Last year, despite the biblical weather the race was awarded the Howard Williams Trophy for the Best Road Race in Essex.

The race will start at 9.45am Hannakins Farm Community Centre and finish at Brightside School. As in previous years, Residents in the vicinity of Hannakins Farm Community Centre are asked for their forbearance as additional parking expected in streets close to Community Centre. However, runners have been advised to park respectfully and should not cause any inconvenience to local residents in the area. This year we hope to be providing additional spill-over parking as in previous years.

Other roads which will be affected by the race will be: Maplebrook Mews, Upland Road, Rosebay Avenue, Queens Park Avenue, Stock Road, Ingatestone Road and Mountnessing Road. Please be patient during the race—there will be marshals along the route to assist traffic and ensure the safety of the runners. The race is run with the available help from the Police and the Council have been advised.

The race is the largest sporting event in Billericay and is contested by Essex elite

athletes, fun runners and first timers - all are welcome. As mentioned, the race is already sold out, but please keep an eye on our "Billericay Striders 10K" Facebook page as occasionally people are often looking for others to swap with.



Protect Your Legacy and Plan Ahead




