



Billericay Police Station haunting: OFFICER STILL ON DUTY?

illericay Police Station is amongst one of the most haunted police stations in Essex. Strange occurrences have been mentioned more times than any other site, and crucially, attributed to George Manning an ex-police Chief Inspector who was killed on his last day on duty before his retirement in 1976.

People who have worked in the building have reported freezing cold temperatures in one side of the building; mystery footsteps along stairways, corridors and then suddenly in the loft, banging and crashing doors, keys jumping off hooks.

"Various staff have mentioned strange feelings of 'not being alone' when they were alone in the building. It's a large building, essentially 2 buildings put together so it runs left to right with a long corridor. One night turn some years ago – about 4 years ago, I was finishing a shift. It was about 2am I recall, I was sitting at a computer finishing up. I was to my knowledge the only person in the building. From upstairs came the sound of doors being closed. A definite 'clunk' closure sound. This was to be fair a little disconcerting. I

was tucked away in an office downstairs and had to go upstairs to put my kit away. Needless to say, it felt odd, like someone was in a nearby room. I hurried out and went home rapidly. I wasn't the only person to have heard this. Other staff also reported a series of doors opening and closing too."

Billericay

Chief Inspector George Manning was a Welshman, born in Glamorgan. He was educated at the London Choir School. He served with the 6th Airborne Division throughout the Second World War. Regarded as a hero with a silver tongue and twice



decorated for bravery, his death was mourned by hundreds.

Perhaps part of the spirit of George still lies within the walls of the building.

any of you have already heard that there will be a new waste and recycling service starting this November in the Basildon borough.

What will change?

There will be a weekly separated recycling service. Each household will receive;

- · One black wheeled bin
- Two new reusable sacks one white for plastics and cans and the other blue for paper and cardboard. (This will replace weekly pink sack service).

What you need to do from 27 November onwards:

 Place your black sacks into your provided black wheeled bin and place out for collection on the same day as your orange glass box.

- Separate your recyclable materials into the appropriate reusable sacks.
 Paper and card materials will need to go in your blue reusable sack and plastics and cans into your white reusable sack.
- Place your reusable sacks out weekly on your usual collection day, crews will empty these and return them to the collection point empty for you to use again.

Please store your new containers until the new service starts on Monday 27 November. Refuse crews will start collecting from this date, please do not put the containers out before this.

Together we are making a difference to help tackle climate change by recycling and creating a cleaner, greener borough.

Although it was a fine summer's day, Monday September 4th was a very sad day for all park lovers, when a severe fire unfortunately badly damaged the old boathouse. The cause is believed to possibly have been an electrical fault, although, according to the fire report, there was no conclusive evidence. The Parks and Countryside Team are of course working hard to resolve the problem of the power to the aeration system, as well as following up other issues.



The boathouse had long been an attractive feature of the park, being home to the old boats that used to be kept nearby. It is believed to have been built, using old munition boxes from the second world war, in late 1948, by a Mr J.E. Colliss and



Mr F.H.Hawes, who also built the landing stage and many of the boats. Unfortunately, these two gentlemen remain a mystery, but if anyone knows more about them, we shall be pleased to hear from you. At the time, the park was considered the main beauty spot in the whole district, with many people travelling from far and wide to visit. The main park entrance was at Lake Avenue in those days and the local streets were crammed with cars and buses. In that first season of boating in 1949, over 2,000 people were expected over the Whitsun Bank holiday. For many years, the boat keeper was Alec Taylor, who used to stack the boats every evening, sometimes with the help of a local lad. The boats varied from rum-tums, large and small wooden boats, to canoes and children's paddle boats.

Recently, the old boathouse has been used by the Billericay Boat Club and also the parkrun, as well as being used at Carols in the park by the Friends. It is very much hoped that the boathouse can either be repaired or rebuilt, so that this peaceful corner of our park can regain its dignity and beauty.

Billericay Tree Wardens (BTW)

High Street Tree Brought Back from the Brink!

here are several attractive purple flowering ornamental Crape Myrtle trees planted along the Billericay High Street at the southern end. They are on the side where the Library is and extend as far as the Red Lion.

A tree species from eastern Asia that is normally drought tolerant and requires really hot weather to come into flower! The peeling rosy patterned bark is as appealing as its flowers.

However, the BTW had noticed that one of the Crape Myrtle's had partially succumbed through lack of water and many thanks to the coffee shop Queenies that it stands outside, as they agreed to periodically water the tree. It has now fully recovered and is thriving.

Did You Know?

Trees have the ability to communicate with each other via their roots! Woodland trees can be aware of each other's presence and signal to each other when pests are invading their foliage. That can trigger a tree's chemical defences. Specialist fungal strands work in partnership with the tree roots just under the surface and interconnect with neighbouring trees of various species. Known as mycelium. These also provide nutrients to trees that are struggling to survive. Woodlands and copses sometimes have a "mother" tree!

Resolving your divorce differences in alternative ways

Since the introduction of no-fault divorce on 6 April 2022, couples can divorce or end their civil partnership without the need to apportion blame or rely on a period of separation.

It is essential that couples address the financial claims they have against one another when they divorce or dissolve their civil partnership – these claims might be for property, lump sums, maintenance and pensions.

The divorce process simply dissolves the marriage or civil partnership.

Where possible, the couple should attempt to resolve matters by way of agreement, but if that doesn't prove possible there are other options:

- **Mediation** Mediation is an alternative dispute resolution process. The couple meet with a professionally trained, neutral and independent mediator who helps them to work out the arrangements for the children and/or the finances.
- Arbitration Arbitration is another alternative dispute resolution method that allows you to resolve your differences outside of the court arena. In brief, you jointly appoint an arbitrator to make a decision that is intended to be final and binding on everyone.

 Collaborative law – each party instructs a lawyer who is trained in collaborative law. Four-way meetings then take place and the parties and their lawyers work together to reach a settlement.

The divorce process is the same regardless of whether you choose to resolve the associated financial or child related issues collaboratively, through alternative dispute resolution or via court proceedings.

Why do you need legal advice?

Even years after a divorce is finalised, financial claims can be made by either party. Married couples are under a duty to financially support one another and this duty does not automatically come to an end when the Final Order is received. To sever those ties, a separate Financial Order needs to be made.


